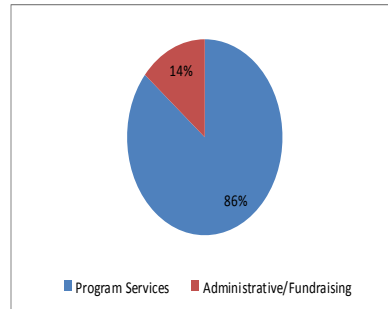
ECONOMIC IMPACT:

To provide a year's work of instruction to one youth (which includes an additional year of follow-up for seniors) costs less than \$1,400 per participant. Our working graduates "repay" that amount in payroll taxes in less than 14 months on the job.

HISTORY:

Since our founding in 2003, JOG-Miami Valley, dba YES! For Youth has served 8,500 youth participants throughout the Miami Valley by reducing barriers to academic success and employment.

MENU OF SERVICES

The **JAG School-to-Career Transition Program** assists young people in grades 9-12 to graduate and successfully transition from school to appropriate post-secondary opportunities. A full-time JAG Career Specialist provides services to high school seniors or junior/seniors at risk of not graduating. Students receive services in one class period per day, usually for academic credit. The JAG competency-based curriculum is utilized to prepare the students with the skills needed to gain entry-level employment. Job placement and follow-up services are provided for one year after graduation.

The **JAG Graduate Recovery Program** assists out-of-school youth ages 16-24 with the attainment of a high school diploma or GED. Participants are also encouraged to attain an occupational skills certificate. Job placement and follow-up services are provided for one year after graduation.

The **WIOA Employability Skills and Work Experience Program** is an abbreviated version of the in-school program designed to serve those youth who desire to be a part of the program, but attend a school that does not have JAG services. In addition, these participants also have the opportunity to take part in a subsidized work experience program.

The **Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program (CCMEP)**. The state of Ohio has created new framework for serving low-income Ohioans ages 16 to 24, through an integrated intervention program that combines the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program and the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Youth program. This new state program addresses the challenge of helping the emerging workforce prepare for and find meaningful employment and become the key to Ohio's economic success, and to breaking the cycle of poverty for thousands of Ohioans. YFY Serves CCMEP participants in all of the counties in our service area.



YES! For Youth

Program Overview *JOG-Miami Valley*, doing business as **YES! For Youth**, is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and an affiliate of **Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG)**, one of the oldest and largest school-to-career transition programs in the country.

Our JAG programs provide youth participants with guidance, academic support, leadership development and team-building along with work experience opportunities through high school. Upon graduation or attainment of a GED, our participants will also receive twelve months of follow-up services to assist in that successful transition into entry-level employment with advancement potential, or into full-time college or training.

Mission Statement To empower youth and young adults with knowledge and skills to succeed in their chosen career path.

Vision Statement That all youth and young adults graduate and become contributing, self-sufficient, responsible citizens through continuing education, employment, or military.
